Methodology

A random sample of 1,199 Palestinians, over the age of 18 years, were interviewed face-to-face throughout the West Bank and Gaza Strip on 24 and 25 October 1996. The interviews were conducted on randomly selected homes, and the subjects inside each home were also selected randomly according to Kish tables. The interviews were conducted in 64 sampling points chosen randomly according to population.

In the **West Bank**, 753 people were surveyed from the following areas: Bethlehem, Beit-Sahour, Beit-Jala, Battir, Husan, Hebron, Arrub Refugee Camp, Halhul, Bani Naim, Tarqumiya, Thahiriya, Dura, Jenin, Tubas, Zababdeh, Jenin Refugee Camp, Yamoun, Ya'bad, Qabatiya, Nablus, Balata Refugee Camp, Beit Dajan, Burqa, Salfit, Beit Wazan, Beit Iba, Asira Al-Qibliya. Tulkarem, Tulkarem Refugee Camp, Atil. Qalqiliya. Jericho, Auja, Ramallah, Al-Bireh, Jalazone Refugee Camp, Birzeit, TurmusAyya, Sinjil, Ramoun, Beitin. Jerusalem: Old City, Sheikh Jarah, Wadi al-Joz, Silwan, Ras al-Amoud, Al-Ram, Dahiyat al-Bareed, Anata, Anata Refugee Camp.

In the Gaza Strip, 446 people were surveyed from: Beit Lahiya, Rafah, Rafah Refugee Camp, Al-Sheikh Radwan, Al-Shaja'ieh, Nnaser, Riaml al-Shamaliya, Rimal al-Janoubiyah, Sabra, Beach Refugee Camp, Maghazi, Bani Suheila, Deir Al-Balah, Al-Breij, Jabaliya, Jabaliya Refugee Camp, Nuseirat, Khan Younis, Khan Younis Refugee Camp.

The major of error is 3% with a confidence level of 95%.

Sample Distribution

- 58.5% of the respondents were from the West Bank
- 37.2% from the Gaza Strip
- 4.3% from Jerusalem
- 48.7% were male
- 51.3% were female
- 63.1% were married
- 29.4% were single
- 3.9% were widowed
- 1.3% were divorced
- 2.3% No answer
- The average of age of the respondents was 33 years.
