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30 years after Oslo: declining support Palestinian public supports maintaining the PNA Rise in the percentage of support for armed resistance Increased discrepancy between public opinion in the West Bank and Gaza

Continued decline of trust in the Oslo Accords

A public opinion poll conducted by the Jerusalem Media and Communication Centre (JMCC) coinciding with the 30-year anniversary of the Oslo Accords, showed an increased decline in the percentage of those who support the accords, especially in the West Bank, compared to the Gaza Strip.

The percentage of those who support the accords in the past 10 years, dropped from 43.3% in 2013 to 27.3% in September of this year. It is noteworthy that the percentage of those who oppose it in the West Bank is more those in the Gaza Strip, at 61.4% in the West Bank and 50.9% in the Gaza Strip.

Similarly, the percentage of those who said they believe the Oslo Accords served Palestinian national interests, dropped from 24.6% in 2013 to 14.9% in September of this year. In comparison, the percentage of those in the West Bank who said it had harmed national interests was 52.2% and 38.1% in the Gaza Strip.

Majority in the West Bank support the one-state solution while the majority in the Gaza Strip support the two-state solution

The poll also showed a continuing slow but steady decline in the overall position on the two-state solution, whereby the percentage of respondents who said the two-state solution was the preferred solution, dropped from 39.3% in April, 2021 to 27.3% this September. However, there was a noticeable, continued increase in the percentage of respondents who support the two-state solution in the Gaza Strip, in comparison with the West Bank, whereby in the Gaza Strip, support stood at 35.3% while in the West Bank, it was 22%.

Nonetheless, the poll reflected pessimism towards the possibility of the establishment of a Palestinian state, with 52.3% of respondents saying they did not expect a Palestinian state to be established in the coming 10 years, opposed to 39.9% who said they did expect this.

In all cases, the largest percentage of respondents, 57.5%, said they believed the end of the occupation, the establishment of a Palestinian state on the 1967 borders, including Jerusalem, and the return of refugees, could constitute a suitable solution, with the percentage of those who said it was suitable in the West Bank, 62.2%, were more than those in the Gaza Strip, 50.3%.

On the issue of Palestinian national reconciliation between Fatah and Hamas, the poll showed slight optimism, with 52.8% of respondents saying they expected reconciliation to be achieved in the next five years, while 37.8% said they did not. Also, optimism towards reconciliation was higher in the West Bank than in the Gaza Strip.



Two-thirds of the public supports maintaining the PNA

The poll showed a steady two-thirds percentage of those who believe it is necessary to maintain the PNA and not dissolve it. 27% of respondents said it should be dissolved as opposed to 67% who said it should be maintained.

Noticeable increase in public support for armed struggle and armed resistance

The poll results showed a rise in the percentage of those who support military and armed operations as the best method of achieving the goals of the Palestinian people, from 30% in July of last year, to 37.1% this September, as opposed to a drop in support for peaceful negotiations as a method of achieving the goals of the Palestinian people, from 37.5% last July to 28% this September.

Likewise, the percentage of those who support continued armed operations against Israeli targets and consider them as an appropriate response to the current conditions, went up from 38.1% last July, to 43.8% this September.

Nevertheless, respondents were divided over their position towards one method of resistance, rocket fire from the Gaza Strip into Israel, whereby 48.4% of respondents said it was an effective means, most of whom are from the West Bank while 39.4% said it was ineffective, most of whom are from the Gaza Strip.

Continued drop in the public's trust in political factions and personalities

The public's trust in political factions and personalities continued to decline, with a rise in the percentage of those who do not trust political factions, from 43.3% last July, to 59% this September. Moreover, the percentage of those who do not trust any political personality rose from 48.1% last July to 56.6% this September.

In response to the question of whether the PLO represents Palestinians everywhere, respondents were divided between those who said the PLO does represent the people, at 49.1% and those who said it does not represent the people, at 43.3%, in addition to 7.5% who had no answer.

Majority supports the government's reintroduction of the topic of social security

76.3% of respondents said they encouraged the Palestinian government's reintroducing the idea of social security, while 19.7% who said they did not. It should be noted that the percentage of those who support social security in the Gaza Strip was 91.5% as opposed to 66% in the West Bank.

Majority believes strikes harm Palestinian interests

With the recent increase of strikes on the Palestinian street, the majority of respondents, 72.3% said the strikes harmed Palestinian national interests, it is noteworthy that percentage of those who said that the strikes harmed are from the West Bank (82.6%) as opposed to 57.2% from the Gaza Strip.

While 23.2% of the respondents said the strikes serve these interests, noting that the most support for strikes comes from the Gaza Strip.

Freedom of expression

In regards to the recent debate on freedom of expression in Palestinian society, the poll showed that 26.2% of respondents said freedom of expression was not permissible, as opposed to 71.4% who said it was permissible to a low or great extent. In response to the question about the extent to which they feel free to express their opinions on social media, 33.6% said they do not feel free, while 61.3% said they feel free to a great, moderate or minimal extent.



Methodology:

A random sample of 1200 people over the age of 18 was interviewed face-to-face throughout the West Bank and Gaza Strip between 13rd And 18th September 2023 the interviews were conducted in randomly selected homes, and the respondents inside each home were also selected randomly according to Kish tables. The interviews were conducted in 134 sampling points chosen randomly according to population.

In the West Bank 715 people were surveyed from the following areas:

Bethlehem: Bethlehem, Beit Jala, Al Khader, Al Ma'sara, Duheisha refugee camp. Nablus: Nablus, Sabastiya Rujeib, Deir Sharaf, Beit Dajan, Balata refugee camp. Salfit: Salfit, Kafr Al-Dik. Tulkarem: Tulkarem, Attil, Al-Nazla Al-Sharqiya, Nur shams refugee camp. Qalqilya: Qalqilya, Kufr Thulth.

In the Gaza Strip 485 people were surveyed from the following areas:

Gaza: Al-Jdaideh, Al-Tufah, Al-Shekh Radwan, Al-Zaytoun, Al-Rimal South, Tal Al-Hawa, Sabra, Al-Rimal North, Al-Shekh Ajleen, Old City, Al-Durj, Al-Naser, Al-Turkuman, Al-Shati refugee camp, Al-Mughraqa. Khan Younis: Khan Younis, Bani Suheila, Al-Qarara, Abasan al-Saghira, Khan Younis refugee camp. Rafah: Rafah, Rafah refugee camp. Gaza North: Beit Hanoun, Jabalya, Jabalya refugee camp. Deir al-Balah: Deir al Balah, Al-Bureij Al-Zawaydeh, Al-Nuseirat, Al-Maghazi refugee camp, Al-Bureij refugee camp.

The margin of error is ± 3 percent, with a confidence level of 95%.

Sample Distribution

50.4% of the respondents were from the West Bank, 9.2% from Jerusalem, 40.4% from the Gaza Strip.

15.4% said they live in villages, 8.3% refugee camps, and 76.3% in towns/cities.

50% were male, 50% female.

68.8% were married, 24.7% single, 5% widowed, 1.5% divorced.

The average age of the respondents was 39 years.
