**Poll Result On Palestinian Attitudes Towards
The Palestinian Political Issues**

Significant Opinion results

- There is a significant increase in ratio of Palestinians who consider the religious factor as an important factor when voting in the next Palestinian Legislative Council (PLC) elections.
- A large majority of Palestinians (75.1%) want to participate in the next PLC elections.
- In case the elections programs are based on choice between fundamentalist trends versus secular trends, the largest ratio of Palestinians (48.6%) said it will choose the fundamentalist trends.
- The poll shows there is a clear majority (60.5%) of Palestinians who oppose the PLC member to be a minister in the government at the same time.
- Mahmoud Abbas got the highest ratio of trust (24.8%) while (32.9%) said they don't trust any figure.
- The poll results show slight decline in Fatah Movement popularity while Hamas Movement maintained a consistent ratio of trust with an increase in ratio of Palestinians who do not trust any faction.
- There is a notable rise in ratio of Palestinians who oppose the continuation of the Aqsa Intifada in the West Bank and Gaza Strip despite the fact that the majority of Palestinians still support it.
- The poll shows a majority of Palestinians who oppose continuation of military operations against Israeli targets and see such operations as harmful to the Palestinian national interests.
- Palestinians are divided almost equally on the issue of suicide bombing operations against Israeli civilians.
- A significant majority of Palestinians (65.2%) believe that the Palestinian national interests require maintaining the state of calm (ceasefire) between Palestinians and Israelis until the end of 2005, but there is also a majority of Palestinians (54.6%) who oppose using force by the security forces against those who violate the calm understandings.
- A majority of Palestinians (52.8%) see in Sharon's unilateral withdrawal from Gaza Strip as a step that can contribute to peace while (33.4%) say such a step harms a just peace between both sides.

Positions regarding the next PLC elections:

There is a significant increase in ratio of Palestinians who want to participate in the next PLC elections from (59.2%) in January 1996 to (75.1%) in May 2005.

The educational qualification, the struggle history, political affiliation and the religious factor emerged as the most important factors that will influence the voter in the next PLC elections. A ratio of (92.6%) of Palestinians said the educational qualification of the candidate is very important or important when they choose their representative in the next parliament while (86.1%) said the struggle history of the candidate is very important or important. A ratio of (86.1%) said political affiliation is a very important or important factor that will influence the voting and the religious factor was chosen by (82.9%) of the Palestinians as a very important or important factor in the next PLC elections.

When asked if the elections programs are based on secular trends versus fundamentalist trends, the highest ratio of Palestinians (48.6%) said they will choose the fundamentalist trends while (38.6%) said they will choose the secular trends.

The poll results show that a ratio of (47.9%) of Palestinians believe that some of the current PLC members will be re-elected while (30.8%) said none of the current PLC members will be re-elected and only (14.5%) said the current PLC members will be re-elected.

With regards to combining between membership in the PLC and government, a majority of Palestinians (60.5%) said they oppose a PLC member becoming a minister in the government at the same time while (33.8%) said they don't mind such a combination.

Trust in Figures and Factions:

In JMCC open ended trend question about the Palestinian figure they trust most, Mahmoud Abbas got the highest level of support (24.8%) among Palestinians which shows a slight decline when compared with (26.2%) in December 2004. Marwan Barghouti ranked second with (5.7%) compared with (9.8%) in the poll conducted in December 2004. Mahmoud Zahhar came in third place with (5.4%). The highest ratio (32%) of Palestinians said they do not trust any figure which shows a rise when compared with (25.4%) in December 2004.

The Poll results show a slight decline in popularity of Fatah Movement from (41.6%) in December 2004 to (36.1%) in May 2005.

The Islamic Resistance Movement, Hamas, maintained a consistent level of trust among Palestinians (19.8%) when compared with (20%) in December 2004.

Performance of the Executive and Legislative Authorities:

When asked about the performance of President Abu Mazen in general, the majority of Palestinians (58.7%) said they were either very satisfied or satisfied to a certain degree towards his performance while a ratio of (38.6%) said they were either dissatisfied to a certain extent or not satisfied at all. When the respondents were asked about the performance of President Abu Mazen as a President of the PNA, a ratio of (52.5%) said his performance is average while (23.8%) said his performance is good and (20.7%) said his performance is bad.

Whether there is corruption in the PA or not, the ratio of Palestinians who believe there is corruption in the PA went down to (61.9%) from (90.3%) in June 2004. A ratio of (22.8%) of Palestinians think there is no corruption in the PA compared with (3.9%) in June 2004. A sizeable ratio of Palestinians (61.8%) said they are not satisfied with the PA administration of public funds while (29.8%) expressed satisfaction.

On the performance of the PLC, a ratio of (40.6%) said the performance of the PLC is either very good or good while (56%) said the PLC performance is either bad or very bad.

The peace process:

There seems to be a stable level of optimism among the Palestinians with regards to the future in general. The majority of the Palestinians (61.3%) are either very optimistic or optimistic in general compared with (59.3%) in December 2004. A ratio of (38.4%) feel very pessimistic or pessimistic compared with (40.2%) last December.

There is still a majority of Palestinians (53.3%) who support the continuation of the Aqsa Intifada, but there is a significant increase in ratio of Palestinians who oppose its continuation (44.1%) compared with (27.2%) in June 2004 and (22.2%) in April 2003.

The poll shows a rise in ratio of Palestinians who oppose suicide bombing operations against Israeli civilians from (31.5%) in June 2004 to (48%) in May 2005 with a notable decline in support to such operations from (62.1%) in June 2004 to (49.7%) this month.

The poll shows that (49.8%) of the Palestinians believe that the Intifada still exists while (46.5%) believe the Aqsa Intifada has ended.

A majority of Palestinians (57.2%) oppose continuation of military operations against Israeli targets and see such operations as harming the Palestinian national interests while (36.2%) believe that such operations are the proper response under the current political conditions.

Methodology

A random sample of 1200 people over the age of 18 was interviewed face-to-face throughout the West Bank and Gaza Strip between 2nd and 7th of May 2005. The interviews were conducted in randomly selected homes, and the subjects inside each home were also selected randomly according to Kish tables. The interviews were conducted in 60 sampling points chosen randomly according to population.

In the **West Bank** 759 people were surveyed from the following areas: **Jenin:** Jenin, al- Yamoun, Jenin refugee camp, Zababdeh, ‘Aqaba, Arabeh, Kufr Rai’, Maythaloun, Sarees **Nablus:** Nablus ,Madama ,Asira al-Qiblia, Yasouf, Marda, Beit Fureek, Balata RC, Sabastia, Zawata.. **Tulkarem and Qalqilya:** Tulkarem, ‘Tulkarem RC, Bala’, Beit Leed, Qalqilia, Jayyous. **Hebron:** Hebron, Halhoul, Idna, al- Dahiria, Dura, Fawwar RC, Taffuh, Tarqoumia. **Bethlehem:** Bethlehem, Beit Sahour, Al Khader, a- Duha, Artas, Deheishe Refugee Camp. **Ramallah & al-Bireh:** Ramallah, al- Bireh, Beit Rima, Ramoun, Al- Am’ary Refugee Camp, Kuber. **Jerusalem:** a – Dahia, a- Ram, Beir Nabala, Qalqilia Refugee Camp, Shufat, Old City, Beit Hanina, Beit Hanina a – tahta, al- ‘Issawia, Wadi al- Joz, Ras al- Amoud

In the **Gaza Strip:** 441 people were surveyed from: **Gaza:** Shati RC, al Zaytoun, Sabra, al-Durj, a-Shuja’ia, al-Rimal north, al-Rimal South, Sheikh Radwan, al-nasser, al-Tuffah. **Khan Younis:** al-Khuza’, Khan Younis, Bani Suheila, Khan Younis RC, al-Qararah. **Rafah:** Rafah, Tal al- Sultan RC, Rafah RC. **Gaza North:** Jabalia, Beit Lahia, Jabalia RC, Beit Hanoun. **Deir al-Balah:** Deir al-Balah, al-Maghazi RC, al-Bureij RC, al-Nusseirat RC.

The margin of error is 3 percent, with a confidence level of 95.

Sample Distribution

53.3% of the respondents were from West Bank, 9.9% from Jerusalem, 36.8% from the Gaza Strip.

29.4% said they live in villages, 16.0% in refugee camps, and 54.6% in towns/cities.

52.3% were male, 47.7% were female.
68.3 % were married, 24.9%, single, 2.4% widowed, 2.5% divorced, 1.9% no answer.

The average age of the respondents was 34 years.
